Seminars

This year our seminar series featured Professor Helmuth Cremer giving a talk entitled “The Postal Sector in the 21st Century”. Professor Cremer’s areas of expertise are in public economics and industrial organization. He is currently a Professor of Economics at the University of Toulouse. Professor Cremer has previously held faculty positions at the University of Liege, Belgium and Virginia Polytechnic Institute, US. He received his B.A. in Economics from the University of Liege in 1981 and his Ph.D. in Economics from University of Louvain in 1987. Professor Cremer is also a Research Director at the Institut d’Economie Industrielle at Toulouse, which is the leading research center in Industrial Economics in Europe. He is a consultant with the Royal Mail, England, La Poste, France, France Telecom, Electricite de France, Gaz de France, Pfizer, the European Commission, and Microsoft Corporation. He is a member of the “Conseil Economique de la Nation” the council of economic advisors of the French minister of Finance.

Professor Cremer is Associate Editor of the *Journal of Public Economics*, *Journal of Public Economic Theory*, *B.E. Journals of Economic Analysis and Policy*, *Finanzarchiv*, and the *German Economic Review*. He is the recipient of numerous awards and grants. He has published extensively in some of the most prestigious journals including *Economic Journal*, *International Economic Review*, *Journal of Public Economics*, *European Economic Review*, *Journal of Urban Economics*, and *International Journal of Industrial Organization*.

Field Trips

In addition to providing a quality academic program, one of the main goals of the MSPE program is to provide students the opportunity to see different parts of the United States and experience the many different aspects of American business and culture. These field trips, taken throughout the academic year, provide this opportunity and at the same time allow students a moment to relax from their demanding academic job. The program scheduled six field trips during the previous academic year.

One of the purposes of the program field trips is to give students an opportunity to understand how government institutions work in the United States. Springfield, the state capital of Illinois, is only a short distance from Urbana-Champaign. The Governor's Office of Management and Budget hosted the MSPE group in September. This office is responsible for and prepares the Governor's annual state budget. The office also advises the Governor on the availability of revenues and

the allocation of those resources to agency programs. Presentations on varying aspects of the operating budget, revenue, capital budget, and debt management were given by officials from various state departments including the Governor’s office of Management and Budget, Department of Revenue, and the Department of Natural Resources.

Students also enjoyed a visit to the new Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum located in Springfield. The museum is dedicated to showcasing the life and times of an amazing person and president, while the library is a major repository for historic materials relating to the state of Illinois.

The next trip was to the Archer-Daniels-Midland Company headquarters in Decatur. ADM is one of the leading multinationals in the agriculture and food industries, and is a leading worldwide provider of nearly 1,000 ingredients for virtually every food application. In addition to an interesting presentation on the world grain situation, the tour of facilities in which new technologies have been developed in agriculture and fish breeding were fascinating. It showed how technology could be useful in solving the problems of feeding a huge population and at the same time preserving vital environmental resources.

The last fall field trip was in November and took students to a landfill outside Chicago managed by Waste Management. In the world today a big problem is how to get rid of the waste created by urban life in an environmentally friendly way. Waste Management is trying to provide answers and solutions to this problem. By using environmentally friendly tactics, Waste Management has already been successful in filling and closing one landfill at the site in Geneva, IL. This landfill was then converted to a golf course and houses other recreational activities on the area. Waste Management works with public utilities to use the naturally produced gas from the landfill to generate enough electricity to light about 10,000 residential homes in the area. Waste Management is also a founding member of the greenhouse gases market on the Chicago Board of Trade. The concept of recycling and managing a landfill that is situated in the middle of a populated area was quite interesting for the students.



The spring semester started with a field trip to Eli Lilly, which is a leading pharmaceutical corporation headquartered in Indianapolis, IN. Lilly pharmaceutical products help treat many conditions such as depression, schizophrenia, attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder, diabetes, and osteoporosis, to name a few. The company was founded in 1876 and has grown to employ more than 43,000 employees worldwide, producing products that

are marketed in 146 countries. Approximately 8,300 of those employees are engaged in research and development of products. The R&D investment in 2002 was 19 percent of sales. After touring the downtown facilities, two presentations including information on patents, and the U.S. Medicare drug program were given.

New York City welcomed the MSPE students during Spring Break, March 19-24, 2006. A favorite trip for students of the program, the group stayed in the heart of



Manhattan near Times Square, within walking distance of Central Park and Broadway theatres. The first stop during the week was a visit to the United Nations. In addition to a tour of the UN, a presentation was given by Mr. Donald Lee titled "Development Issues and the New Approaches by the UN to Overcome the Backwardness and Poverty".

The next day took us to Standard & Poor's, one of the world's preeminent providers of credit ratings and the globally recognized financial-market indices the S&P 500®. Very informative and interesting presentations were given by Mr. Robert Cangemi, Director of Quantitative Analytics, on "Estimation Methods for Risk Analysis" and Mr. Ashwani K. Aggarwal, Director of Risk Solutions, on "Introducing S&P products".

On the third day, Dr. Saied Tousi, Senior Vice President of Pall Corporation, gave a very informative talk entitled "Corporate Culture: Defining the Rules of the Game". Dr. Tousi gave very good information to the students on how to be successful in a multinational arena. Pall Corporation is the global leader in the field of filtration, separations and purification and provides products in biotechnology, pharmaceutical, transfusion medicine, semiconductors, water purification, aerospace and broad industrial markets.

The final presentation for the week was at the Council of Foreign Relations. The Council is an example of private think tanks that provide a forum for scholars to voice their thoughts on different issues and help to shape policy in different fields. This was a great opportunity for students to learn more about these kinds of institutions and how they work. In addition, this time we were honored to hear a lecture on globalization by Prof. Bhagwati, one of the prominent scholars in the field of international trade. Prof. Bhagwati was also kind enough to allow the students a chance for a question and answer session at the conclusion of his lecture. I must say the CFR visit was one of the highlights of the trip!

The last field trip of spring 2006 was to Chicago in April. Chicago is always fun and interesting, and downtown has one of the most attractive and

architecturally interesting landscapes. One of the presentations was given by a graduate of the UIUC economic departments PhD Program! Mr. Mashayekhi, who is currently working at Moody's KMV, gave a presentation on risk rating analysis. Moody's KMV (like S&P) is one of the top providers of credit risk measurement and credit risk management tools to the financial services, insurance and money management clients.

Field trips are a very important component of the students' education in the MSPE Program. Therefore any suggestions for its improvement, especially by alumni who themselves have experienced many of these trips, are very welcome.

Faculty News

Craig Olson, a Professor at the Institute of Labor and Industrial Relations, has joined the Economics department in a joint appointment. Professor Olson received his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1979. His specialization is in labor economics.

Lee, Changbok, Spring '86, is Senior Adviser at Global Markets – International Client Group, ABN-Amro Bank. He received his Ph.D. in International Finance at Kyunghee University of Korea in 1999.

Lee, Seong-Tae, Summer '88, a deputy governor of the Bank of Korea, has been designated as the new Governor of the Central Bank. Lee succeeds Park Seung whose term ended in March.
